

Spotlight on Composers

GIOVANNI PIERLUIGI da PALESTRINA (1525 – 1594)

Born in Palestrina (Praeneste, Rome), was an Italian composer of Renaissance music. He was the most famous 16th Century representative of the Roman School of music composition.

He had a tremendous influence on the development of Roman Catholic church music. He started as a choirboy in Rome and studied the organ. By the time he was in his early 20's, he was already an accomplished and well-respected member of church musicians, holding the office of maestro di cappella at the Julian Chapel (Rome) after his first published compositions made so favourable an impression with Pope Julius III.

His compositions are typified as very clear, with voice parts well-balanced and beautifully harmonized. It is probable that Palestrina was conscious of the needs of intelligible text in conformity with the Counter-Reformation movement and wrote his works towards this end.

His works were so prolific, they inspired subsequent composers: JS Bach & Gregorio Allegri.
